St. Joseph's Pre-University College

St. Joseph's Pre-University College is a religious minority institution. The college and its sister institutions are managed by the Karnataka Jesuit Education Society (KJES) under the aegis of the Society of Jesus. The Society of Jesus is a Catholic religious order founded by St. Ignatius of Loyola in 1540. The members of the society are popularly known as Jesuits. The Jesuits have been active in the field of education throughout the world since their origin. Although religious by composition, the services of this society have touched young people without any distinction of religion, cast or creed.

Aims and Objectives (KJES)

Jesuit education draws its inspiration from the life and teachings of Jesus Christ and the institutional character is based on the principles of formation elaborated upon by St. Ignatius of Loyola. The vision and principles give Jesuit institutions their unique character and invite the staffs and students to strive to live up to them. Concretely, it would mean:

- **Openness to Growth**

Our College aims to inculcate the five C's of St Ignatian values from the Jesuit Education to be Conscience, Competent, Committed, Compassionate and build Character in the heart and mind of young ones.. A student is expected to mature as a person emotionally, intellectually, socially and religiously to a level that reflects responsibility for his own growth as opposed to a passive, drifting and selfish attitude. The student must begin to reach out towards his development, seeking opportunities to expand his mind, imagination, feelings and religious consciousness. One needs to learn to move beyond self-interest or self-centeredness in relation to others and reflect the confidence and freedom of a mature person.

- **Intellectual Competence**

A mastery of academic requirements for advanced forms of education is to be cultivated. The student needs to see the need for intellectual integrity in a personal quest for truth and justice. This would mean: a 'Josephite' is expected to develop intellectual skills and understanding, which cut across and go beyond academic requirements.

- **Academic Excellence**

The primary aim of our education is to strengthen our base for academic excellence. Academic excellence does not merely remain at the level of

high percentage results but to the extent we are able to train persons into various strata of knowledge. This is done through different associations and activities, which are intellectually oriented such as quiz, debate, lecture contest...

- **Commitment to Justice**

The college helps students to acquire awareness to meet the needs of local and wider communities. It is a preparation for the day when students take their legitimate and rightful place in the society as competent, concerned and responsible members. The students are expected to acquire skills necessary to live as persons for others, becoming aware of selfish attitudes and tendencies in one self and society, to strive to overcome them.

- **Religious Development**

The College deeply respects all faiths. The students are expected to have a basic knowledge of the major doctrines and practices of their faith. He is expected to examine his/her religious feelings and beliefs with a view to deepen the basic and fundamental orientation towards God and establish a relationship with religious traditions and community.

- **Physical Development**

Keeping alive its rich legacy in sports, St. Joseph's Pre-University College encourages sports and games, thus catering to the physical growth and development of the students. It is on the playground that the students develop and cultivate team spirit, honesty, co-operation, fair play and habits of health and hygiene.

- **Moral Development**

Adolescents undergo moral growth in stages. They maybe easily influenced by peers or by environmental cues, but most teens grow to assert impressive measures of responsibility in their moral growth. Through counseling and HRD classes, the College ensures that our students develop a sound value system and become morally a responsible persons.

- **Emotional Development**

Adolescence marks the transition from childhood to adulthood, and it involves physiological and hormonal changes. These bodily changes affect their emotions. In order to facilitate smoother and safer transition from childhood to adulthood, the College counsellors and teachers assist them in their journey towards becoming responsible and emotionally healthy persons.

- **Cultural Integrity**

St. Joseph's Pre-University College expects its students to develop a patriotic spirit. This would mean a deep appreciation of the cultural heritage of the country and the capacity to transcend parochial, communal and regional and sentiments. A secular and democratic outlook with a deep loyalty to the Nation and an awareness of current social, economic and political trends gives students the realization of the great task ahead of them as responsible citizens.

- **National Outlook**

Our objective of education involves promoting nationalistic growth and national spirit through educational training. The students are expected to be aware of the Nation's history and events. We create an awareness on the need to protect our environment and combat further depletion of natural resources and climatic change, by adopting eco friendly life style. Eligibility

Candidates, who have passed class X from the Karnataka Secondary Education Board or C.B.S.E or I.C.S.E. recognized as equivalent there to, shall be eligible for admission to the above courses. Admissions are open to boys and girls.

Attendance

Attendance is taken by the lecturers for every class. As per the Pre-University regulations, 85% of attendance in each subject is compulsory to appear for the annual PUC examinations.

Scheme of Examination

In order to maintain academic standards, the college will conduct tests and examinations regularly. Students are encouraged to use these as means of assessing their performance.

Counselling

Counselling facilities is provided by experts to help students whose personal problems are concerned with their psycho-social developmental transition interface with their ability to function in the academic environment.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. a) Classes will be held between 8.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. from Monday to Friday. Saturday between 8.30a.m. and 1p.m. Saturday afternoon will be devoted to extra-curricular activities.
 b) At the first or warning bell for class, given 5 minutes before the hour fixed for each session, students enter class and occupy their places. At the second bell the lecturers enter classes and the student stand in respect to greet and receive them .
2. i. At the stroke of the prayer bell, all must stand in silence and pray along with the choir group no one is suppose to walk around.
 ii. When the attendance is called out, each one rises and answers to his/her name.
3. **Late comers are not allowed to enter the class. They have to spend the time in the library after obtaining a permission note from the Vice Principal. Those who depend on public conveyance to come to the college, should leave their home early enough to avoid peak hours and reach the College in time.**
4. During class, lecture's permission is needed to move away from one's place or to leave the room.
5. Punctual and regular attendance is essential for the formation of character and is therefore insisted upon. Leave of absence from College should be obtained from the concerned authority. Unforeseen absence must be justified on return before entering class with a note of excuse from the parent or guardian. A medical certificate should be furnished especially when a student is absent for a long time due to illness. Medical certificate however does not entitle a student for attendance. The names of students who are absent continuously for 2 weeks, without any notice will not be recorded in the register.
6. Irregularity in attendance, insubordination, discourtesy to members of the Staff, habitual inattention and late coming, neglect of work, and obscenity in word or act will be punishable at the discretion of Student by the Welfare Committee headed by the Principal, Management decision is final.
7. Students attending class or other gatherings within the College are expected to be neatly dressed in accordance with the rules of approved etiquette.
8. Every student must greet the members of staff on the occasion of his/her first meeting for the day.

9. Books, Magazines, Newspapers, CD's etc, not approved By the Management are not allowed to be brought to the College.
10. Every student should posses an Identity Card & College Calendar issued by the College which should be produced whenever asked for, especially when dealing with office and library.
- 11. I PUC students who copy(malpractice) in College Examinations will not be admitted to II PUC and II PUC students will not be allowed to appear for the Final Examinations.**
- 12. Students are not permitted to bring self-driven two & four-wheelers to the College. Those who come on motor-cycles, scooters and mopeds should have a valid driving license and Insurance.**
13. Students who habitually steal or rob will be dismissed from the college.
14. Consumption of alcohol, tobacco or any other banned substances is strictly prohibited. If they do so they will be summarily dismissed.
15. Books, umbrellas etc. should have a name or mark by which the owner can be easily identified; all stray or unclaimed property should be brought to the Vice-Principal's office. College is not responsible for any of their belongings.
16. Students are not allowed to take part in political agitation directed against the authority of Government. They are also forbidden to engage prominently in any public movement without permission from Principal. They are further desired to observe all the disciplinary regulations which the management may frame from time to time
17. Games on the premises cease at 4.30 pm.
18. Catholic students are advised to take frequent sacraments at least every week.
19. Letters officially addressed to the Principal should enclose reply postage. Only official letters will be handed over to the students. Private letters will be re-directed to home or hostel address.
20. Attendance at classes and examination, progress, as well as the conduct of the student will be taken in to consideration while recommending students for merit certificates, concessions, scholarships, higher studies, job as well as for representing the college in extra-mutual activities.
21. Students are not authorised to collect donations from public for any of the College activities without the permission of the Principal.

22. Picnics and educational tours are to be organised with the prior permission of the Principal. For all such programmes written permission of the parents required.
23. The students are not permitted to celebrate any religious festivals birth days within the College campus without permission of the authority.
24. Students are not permitted to bring or use mobile phones, pagers and other electronic gadgets within the college campus. In case if students are caught with the same it will be confiscated and will be returned towards the end of the academic year with Rs.1000.
25. Ragging is a major offence. Those who indulge in ragging, even in a 'friendly way' or encourage ragging, will face immediate dismissal from the College. No justification in this regard is acceptable.
26. Without obtaining prior permission from the Principal, no picnics, send off parties, get-togethers, in which our college students are involved. either in the campus or in any other place are to be organized. No overnight picnics are allowed. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against those who violate these rules.
27. Students should wear decent clothes to the college. Indecent appearance will be severely reprimanded and students will be asked to leave the College campus. See the instructions under Dress Code.
28. Tuitions in any form is strongly discouraged. Students who have particular difficulty in any subject are recommended to approach the lecturers for help. They are also advised to attend remedial classes organized for such students are compulsory.
29. Attendance for Basic Theology class and examination is obligatory on Christian students.
30. Attendance at Value Education class and examination is obligatory on all students. Those who absent themselves without permission or fail in theology/value education examination, will be deprived of any scholarship or prize that they may enjoy.
31. (a) 90% attendance in each subject is compulsory to be eligible for annual PUC examinations. Attendance will be considered till the last working day.
(b) Students with shortage of attendance will not be re-admitted into the college.
(c) The College will conduct two tests - one in the month of August and

the other in the month of December and two examinations one in October and another in January.

(d) Marks card of every examination will be handed over to the parents in person during Parents Teacher's interface, Parents are requested to attend the PTI on specified date and time, **PTI is compulsory.**

32. Elections of Office-Bearers and Class Representatives: Only those students with clean disciplinary record, having good academic standards and a minimum of 90% attendance in I year PUC are eligible to contest in the election for the post of office bearers, class representatives and student council.
33. All the students are reported to be in the college before 8.45 a.m. Students who are coming late regularly will be fined Rs.10 each time.

ಕಾಲೇಜಿನ ನಿಯಮಗಳು

1. ತರಗತಿ ಪ್ರಾರಂಭವಾಗುವುದಕ್ಕೂ 5 ನಿಮಿಷ ಮೊದಲು ಮುಂಜಾಗತೆಯ ಗಂಟೆಯನ್ನು ಬಾರಿಸಲಾಗುವುದು ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಗಳೆಲ್ಲರೂ ಎರಡನೆಯ ಗಂಟೆಗೆ ಮೊದಲೇ ತರಗತಿಗಳನ್ನು ಪ್ರವೇಶಿಸಿ ಸಿದ್ಧರಾಗಿರಬೇಕು. ಉಪನ್ಯಾಸಕರು ತರಗತಿಗೆ ಬಂದಾಗ ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಗಳೆಲ್ಲರೂ ಎದ್ದು ನಿಂತು ಗೌರವ ಸೂಚಿಸಬೇಕು. ಅವರು ಕುಳಿತುಕೊಳ್ಳಿರಿ ಎಂದು ಸೂಚನೆ ನೀಡಿದ ನಂತರ ಕುಳಿತುಕೊಳ್ಳಬೇಕು.
2. ತರಗತಿ ನಡೆಯುವ ಸಮಯದಲ್ಲಿ ಕಾರಣವಿಲ್ಲದೆ ತರಗತಿಯ ಹೊರಭಾಗದಲ್ಲಿ ಓಡಾಡುವುದನ್ನು ನಿಷೇಧಿಸಲಾಗಿದೆ.
3. ಉಪನ್ಯಾಸಕರ ಅನುಮತಿ ಇಲ್ಲದೆ ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಗಳು ತರಗತಿಯಿಂದ ಹೊರಗೆ ಹೋಗುವಂತಿಲ್ಲ.
4. ಉಪನ್ಯಾಸಕರು ಗೈರು ಹಾಜರಾಗಿದ್ದರೆ ಆ ತರಗತಿ ಅವಧಿಯಲ್ಲಿ ಗ್ರಂಥಾಲಯಕ್ಕೆ ತೆರಳಿ ಅಧ್ಯಯನ ಮಾಡಬೇಕು ಅಥವಾ ಬೇರೆ ಉಪನ್ಯಾಸಕರು ಬರುವವರೆಗೆ ಕಾಯಬೇಕು.
5. ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಗಳು ಕಾಲೇಜಿನ ವ್ಯಾಪ್ತಿಯಲ್ಲಿ ಮಧ್ಯಪಾನ, ಧೂಮಪಾನ ಮಾಡುವಂತಿಲ್ಲ. ಇಂತಹ ಘಟನೆಗಳಿಗೆ ಆಸ್ಪದ ಕೊಡುವ ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಗಳನ್ನು ಕಾಲೇಜಿನಿಂದ ಹೊರಹಾಕಲಾಗುವುದು. ಇದು ಶಿಕ್ಷಣ ಇಲಾಖೆಯ ನಿಯಮ.
6. ಕಾನೂನಿನ ಪ್ರಕಾರ ರ್ಯಾಗಿಂಗ್ ಶಿಕ್ಷಾರ್ಹ ಅಪರಾಧ. ಆಕಸ್ಮಿಕವಾಗಿ ರ್ಯಾಗಿಂಗ್ ನಂತಹ ಚಟುವಟಿಕೆಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ತೊಡಗಿದರೆ, ಅಥವಾ ಸ್ನೇಹಪೂರ್ವಕವಾಗಿ ಅಥವಾ ಉತ್ತೇಜನ ನೀಡಿದರೂ ಅಂತಹ ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಗಳನ್ನು ಕಾಲೇಜಿನಿಂದ ತೆಗೆದು ಹಾಕಲಾಗುವುದು.
7. ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಗಳು ಯಾವುದೇ ಕಾರಣಕ್ಕೂ ಸ್ನೇಹಪೂರ್ವಕನಾಗಿಯೂ ಹೊಡೆದಾಡಿಕೊಳ್ಳಬಾರದು. ಗೆದ್ದಾಗ ಪ್ರಚೋದಕ ವಿಜಯೋತ್ಸವಗಳನ್ನು, ಹುಟ್ಟುಹಬ್ಬದ ಸಂದರ್ಭದಲ್ಲಿ ಕೇಕೆ ಹಾಕುವುದನ್ನು ನಿಷೇಧಿಸಲಾಗಿದೆ. ಅದು ರ್ಯಾಗಿಂಗ್ ಗೆ ಪೂರಕವಾದ ವರ್ತನೆ.
8. ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಗಳ ಅಧೀನ ಮಾದಕ ವಸ್ತುಗಳು ಕಂಡು ಬಂದಲ್ಲಿ ಕಠಿಣಕ್ರಮ ತೆಗೆದುಕೊಳ್ಳುತ್ತೇವೆ. ಕಾಲೇಜಿನ ಅವರಣದಲ್ಲಿ ಪಚಾಕಿ ಮತ್ತು ಬಣ್ಣಗಳನ್ನು ಎರಚುವುದನ್ನು ನಿಷೇಧಿಸಲಾಗಿದೆ.
9. ಅಮಿಥೇಯತೆ, ತರಗತಿಯಲ್ಲಿ ಗಮನ ನೀಡದೆ ಇರುವುದು, ಉದಾಸೀನತೆ, ಅಯೋಗ್ಯ ನಡತೆ, ಅವಾಚ್ಯ ಪದಗಳ ಬಳಕೆ ಇವುಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ತೊಡಗಿದ ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಗಳನ್ನು ಕಾಲೇಜಿನಿಂದ ತಾತ್ಕಾಲಿಕವಾಗಿ ಅಥವಾ ಶಾಶ್ವತವಾಗಿ ಅಮಾನತ್ತು ಮಾಡಲಾಗುವುದು.

10. ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿ-ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿನಿಯರು ಎಲ್ಲಾ ಸಮಯದಲ್ಲಿಯೂ ಪ್ರೌಢರಂತೆ ವರ್ತಿಸಿ ತಮ್ಮ ಘನತೆ ಗೌರವಗಳನ್ನು ಕಾಪಾಡಿಕೊಳ್ಳತಕ್ಕದ್ದು, ಪರಸ್ಪರ ಸಂಬಂಧಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ಶಿಷ್ಟತೆ ಮತ್ತು ಸಭ್ಯತೆಯನ್ನು ತೋರಬೇಕು.
11. ಕಾಲೇಜಿನ ಸ್ವಚ್ಛತೆಯನ್ನು ಕಾಪಾಡುವ ನಿಟ್ಟಿನಲ್ಲಿ ಕಾಲೇಜಿನ ಗೋಡೆಗಳ ಮೇಲೆ, ಮೇಜುಗಳ ಮೇಲೆ ಯಾವುದೇ ರೀತಿಯ ಚೀಟಿಗಳನ್ನು ಅಂಟಿಸುವುದು ಮತ್ತು ಬರೆಯುವುದನ್ನು ನಿಷೇಧಿಸಿದೆ. ಕಾಲೇಜಿಗೆ ಸಂಬಂಧಪಟ್ಟಂತಹ ಸ್ವತ್ತನ್ನು ನಾಶಮಾಡುವುದನ್ನು ನಿಷೇಧಿಸಲಾಗಿದೆ. ಅದಕ್ಕೆ ಕಾಲೇಜಿನ ಎಲ್ಲಾ ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಗಳು ಜವಾಬ್ದಾರಾಗಿರುತ್ತಾರೆ.
12. ತರಗತಿಯನ್ನು ಸ್ವಚ್ಛತೆಯನ್ನು, ಕಾಲೇಜಿನ ಆವರಣದಲ್ಲಿ ನೈರ್ಮಲ್ಯವನ್ನೂ ಕಾಪಾಡಬೇಕು. ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಗಳು ತರಗತಿಯೊಳಗೆ ಆಹಾರ ಪದಾರ್ಥಗಳನ್ನು ಸೇವಿಸಬಾರದು, ಕ್ಯಾಂಟಿನ್ ಅಥವಾ ಕಾಲೇಜಿನ ಮುಂಭಾಗದಲ್ಲಿರುವ ಉದ್ಯಾನವನದಲ್ಲಿ ಅಥವಾ ಮೈದಾನದ ಬಳಿ ಸೇವಿಸಬೇಕು.

14. ಕಾಲೇಜಿನ ಹೊರಗೆ ನಡೆಯುವ ಅಸಭ್ಯ ಘಟನೆಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ಕಾಲೇಜಿನ ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಗಳು ಪಾಲ್ಗೊಂಡಲ್ಲಿ ಅಂತಹ ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಗಳನ್ನು ಗಮನಿಸಿ ಸೂಕ್ತ ಕ್ರಮಗಳನ್ನು ಕೈಗೊಳ್ಳಲಾಗುವುದು.

TO PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

Parents and Guardians are requested to co-operate with the college authorities by enforcing discipline and regularity at home. In order that lessons may be duly prepared, students should be devoted to study at home. If parents do not insist on regular attendance and home study, the results are sure to be disappointing to them.

Absence from class should be justified by a leave note on the college calendar from the parents. A leave note for a long absence due to illness must be supported by a medical certificate. A medical certificate does not entitle a student for attendance.

Absence from college examinations will be considered seriously. Absence, even for one subject should be justified by a written note. A medical note is needed in case of illness. Re-examination cannot be considered as a matter of right. In case of illness during the examinations, parents are expected to inform the Principal/class guide immediately.

Some parents express their surprise at the end of the year, due to the

unsatisfactory attendance and progress of their children in spite of our sending reports to them. Parents will be invited for a Parents Teachers interface after every test and every examination where the progress reports of the students will be given.

You are asked to meet the Vice-Principal, student welfare officer's and the class guides or other teachers if unsatisfactory progress or poor attendance is brought to your notice. A minimum of 85% attendance is required to complete the course without which a student is not eligible to take the final examination. They will not be re-admitted to the college.

We expect parents to participate in the parents meeting and be present at other activities of the college like Sports, Cultural events competition and College Day. Attendance during Parents-Teachers interface is obligatory.

In case you are not able to attend for a just reason, a written note should be sent to the Principal. Written information will be sent to the parents about study tours and picnics.

Parents are specially asked not to allow their children who do not have a valid license, to use a motorized vehicle. Parents/Guardians must go through the Calendar regularly or at least once a month to know about the activities conducted by the college and keeps track of the attendance of your ward.

Attendance is compulsory on the opening days after holidays.

LIBRARY RULES

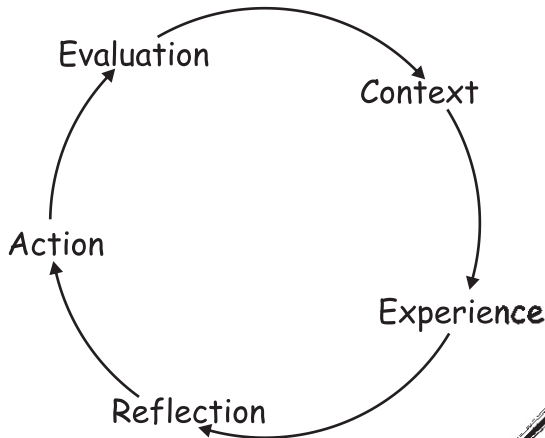
1. The library will be kept open from 3.30 p.m to 4.30 p.m from Monday to Friday and 1.00 p.m to 2.00 p.m on Saturdays.
2. Students can borrow one book at a time for 5 days.
3. Extension of the period of book for another 5 days is possible on the request communicated prior to the due date of return, provided there is no demand for issued item from other students before or on the due date stamped.

4. (a) Issue of books:
Week days : 3.30 p.m to 4.30 p.m
Saturdays : after 1.00 p.m to 1.30 p.m.
(b) Returned and renewal of books:
Week days : 3.30 p.m to 4.30 p.m
Saturdays : 1.00 p.m to 1.30 p.m
5. Penalty for overdue books : Penalty for the late return of the books is fixed at Rs. 5/- for each book per day.
The amount will be calculated taking into account all days following the due date.
6. Reference Books: Reference books are to be referred inside the Library. Under no circumstances, reference books will be issued temporarily either for classroom reading or for reading outside the library.
Reference books may be taken for photocopying after taking due approval from the librarian.
7. Lost/Damaged Library Resources
A student who loses any document borrowed from the library will be responsible for a full face value reimbursement of the document. If the document is no longer available or out of print, the student will have to pay double the value of the lost material.
8. Strict silence must be observed in the library.
Reference books are to be referred inside the Library.
Under no circumstances, reference books will be issued.



B. Ignatian Pedagogy : A Practical Approach

On July 31, 1993, Father Kolvenbach promulgated **Ignatian Pedagogy: A Practical Approach** that aimed to complement and build upon the Characteristics document. Recognizing the diverse settings of Jesuit school, Ignatian Pedagogy puts forth a flexible approach based on broad principles for the Spiritual Exercises. St. Ignatius aimed at teachers, it recommends a five-dimension style of teaching :'=



Clubs and Associations

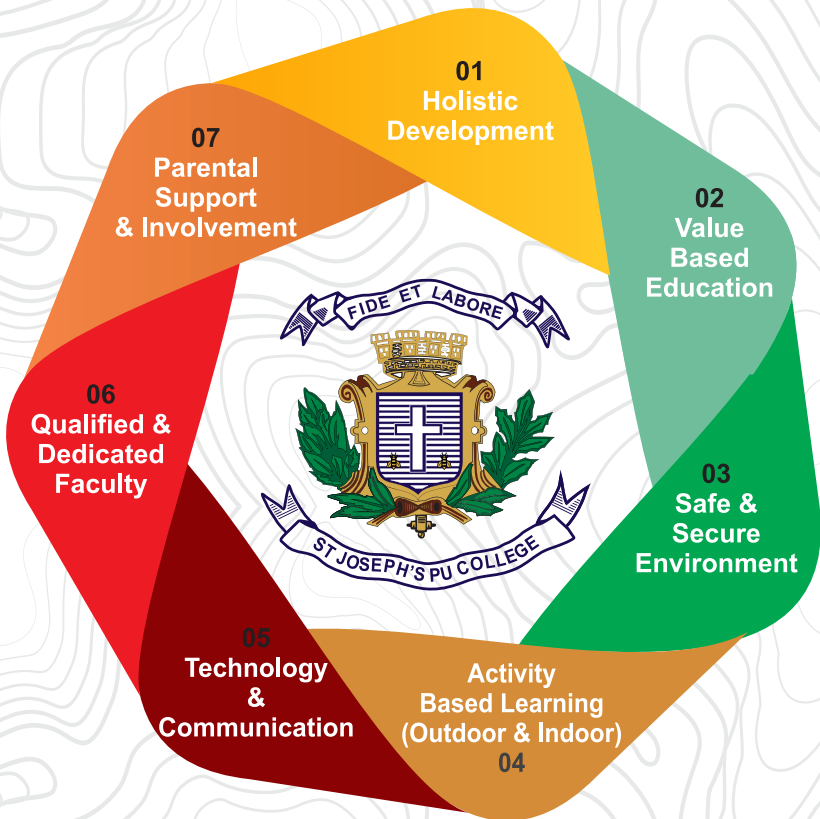
